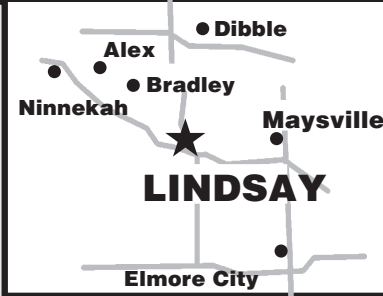

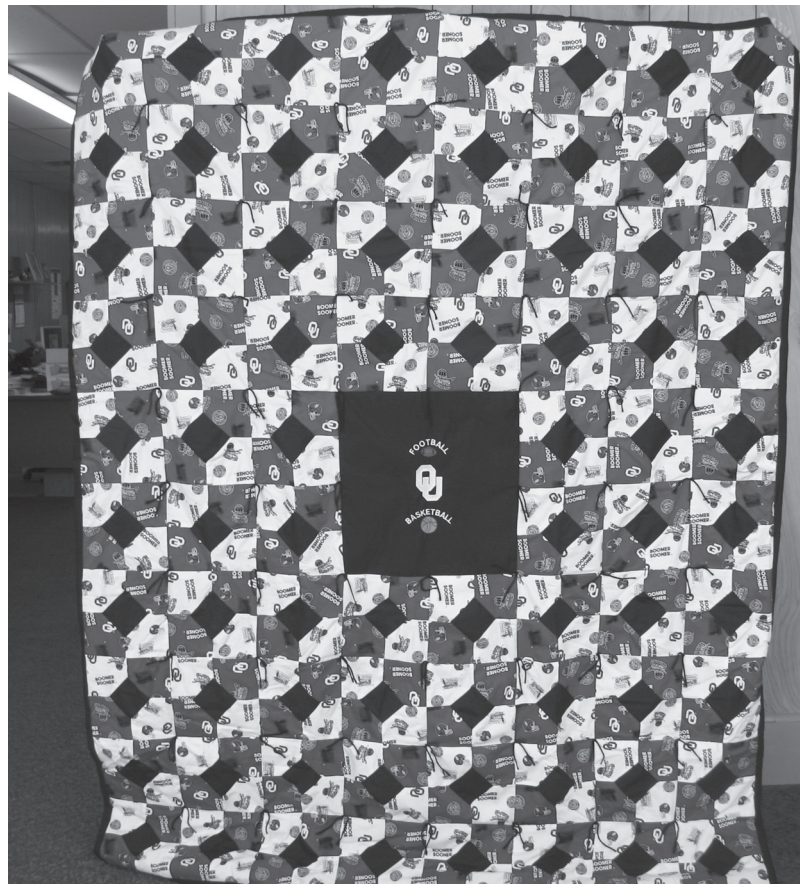
Kayla Davis received the REC scholarship for \$600 and the American Legion Women's Auxiliary scholarship for \$100.

Coach Randy Keck, and the Tulsa University Golden Hurricanes women's golf team are headed for the NCAA Division I National Tournament. Keck was a graduate of Lindsay High School in 1990 and was on back to back state champion golf teams for Lindsay in 1988 and 1989. His parents are Preston and Linda Keck of Lindsay.

The Tulsa golf team won three of their five spring tournaments, won the C-USA Conference title, and placed seventh in the regionals in California. The top 8 teams in regionals get to attend Nationals.

The TU women were in second place after the first day shooting 1 under par. The second day proved to have some problems and their play moved them to eighth place. The third day the girls played their best of the season and were a blistering 11 under par at one time moving them back toward the top. After
